The light was dim. Welcoming the contemplative mood of the Ash Wednesday service, I bowed my head in prayer. However I confess that my prayer was detracted by my tattered purple clerical stole. The edges of its purple fabric were completely frayed. The white embroidery threads were unraveling. It wasn't surprising that this beloved stole looked a bit worn. After all, it has visually declared Advent and Lent for twenty-three years. I just hadn't noticed it. In those meditative worship moments, I thought about how my favorite purple stole reflected the Lenten journey to the cross. For as people of faith, we know we often stand before God a bit rag tagged, with frayed edges, threadbare souls, and tattered behavior. We also know that God always receives us, forgives us, and restores us despite our shabbiness. We experience resurrection over and over again. It truly is God's gift of abundant grace. As Easter people, in a faith community, we are called to emulate God's grace – to be, so to speak, grace-generous people.

During my years at GPC, I have experienced that grace from you. I have been late to meetings completely missed a few meetings. I have called when I shouldn't have and didn't call when I should have. I have stumbled over words – even stumbled over my own two feet. I have warmly greeted you at the door calling you by the wrong name. And remember the Sunday when I served the juice before the bread!?!?! I could go on and on. Indeed, through the years we have accepted each other as human beings, created by God, and forgiven by God. It has been a blessing to be in a community that lives the resurrection.

On Easter morning, we will stand together, rejoicing in the wonder of the empty tomb and the new life that it shouts to people of all times and places. For the discovery of the risen Lord is not simply a onetime event – but is an on-going, each and every day process. In the words of the familiar Easter hymn, “Christ the Lord has risen again, Christ has broken every chain, Alleluia.” Indeed, in the fray of our lives, we discover the grace of God restoring us to new life.
