

FROM THE PASTOR

The morning routine in my house often begins with a conversation that goes something like this:

“Girls it’s time to go brush your teeth.”

“Why?”

“Because those are your permanent teeth and you don’t want them to fall out.”

“Why would my teeth fall out?”

“Because you just ate a bowl full of sugar cereal and now you need to brush the sugar off so you don’t get cavities.”

The conversation continues down the road of the current cost of dental work and an explanation of dentures. Eventually, I arrive at the exasperated parental expression “Because I said so!”

A few months ago when session began talking about the process to review and revise the GPC mission statement, the first reaction was “why?” And clearly the response of “Because I said so” wasn’t going to cut it.

Every few years, we review and revise the mission statement of the congregation because it is a faithful opportunity to reflect on why we do what we do. Most of us who have been a part of the GPC community for any lengthy time can list off *what* we do here. Those who have served in leadership positions in the church might be even be able to explain *how* we do what we do. But sometimes amidst all the “doing” we lose touch with our ability to articulate *why* we do what we do.

Why does Gates Presbyterian Church exist? Why do we get out of bed on a Sunday morning, or out of the house on a Wednesday evening or into the city on Tuesday over lunch or give up a week vacation to spend serving with our youth?

Why do we do what we do?

Simon Sinek gave a TED Talk back in 2009 based on his book “Start With Why: How Great Leaders Inspire Everyone to Take Action.” From a corporate perspective he explains “People don’t buy *what* you do but *why* you do it and that why you do proves what you believe.” Reflecting on this from a church perspective, I would offer that we aren’t part of a church because of what we do, but why we do it and the “why” is a reflection of what we believe. What we are is simple. We are a church. We are one of many churches that happens to be of the Presbyterian variety, located on the west side of Rochester, New York. We are a welcoming, generous, intergenerational community, serving together for a positive change in our local and global communities.

I see the basic “why” rooted in our understandings of God’s promises made known to us through the Bible and the sacraments: We are all children of God, joined to Christ’s ministry of love, peace, and justice and nothing, not even death, can separate us from that love. As I read over the comments from the “Open Table Conversations” what a blessing it is to learn how so many of you come to this church because you also believe “we do what we do” because it is important to come together as a family and a community to give thanks for our many blessings, to hear God’s call, to learn what Jesus has to teach us, to be filled with the Holy Spirit as instruments of God’s justice and love. Your responses remind me of the first verse in a new hymn from the *Glory to God* hymnal, “Together We Serve.”

Together we serve, united by love,
Inviting God’s world to the glorious feast.
We work and we pray through sorrow and joy
Extending God’s love to the last and the least.

It is my hope that we can emerge from this process with a renewed sense of commitment to proclaim the glorious “why” of Gates Presbyterian Church so we might inspire other children of God to engage God’s work of justice, grace, and love with us!

Dear Friends,

We appreciate the joy of being the living body of Christ that is Gates Presbyterian Church. One of the ways in which we do that is in continuing to learn to be adaptive as we serve the glory of God.

Currently one such opportunity is the exploration of how we approach fundraisers. This effort began last year with a series of open discussions about the “why, how, and who” related to our fundraisers. The conversation has been continued by session. All agree that the Church Mouse Bazaar, the Ham Dinner, and the Yard Sale are wonderful ways to build community, both within and beyond the physical walls of our church. In addition, these events have generously contributed to the vision and mission of GPC by supplementing the operating budget. We have been further blessed to have had long-term leaders for these events. These leaders have expressed appreciation for the opportunity to serve, but some feel it is time to contribute their time and talent in other ways.

At our April Session meeting, the elders determined that a formal volunteer leadership structure is needed to move the fundraising vision at GPC forward. Among the recommendations included in this plan are the following:

- Establish of a Fundraising Leadership Recommendation Committee. The purpose of this committee will be to identify and recruit leaders for fundraisers, and to foster succession planning by encouraging members to try a position related to their interests to see how it fits.
- Leadership term limits. A three year term limit for leaders was suggested. This supports a “Learn-Do-Teach” cycle. This will serve two key purposes; mitigating the risk of “burn out”, and assuring a means for the introduction of new energy and ideas to maintain the vitality of our events.
- Encourage leaders to delegate needs to create “bite size” roles in support of the overall effort. This fosters more involvement and accommodates personal availability and abilities.
- Developing a culture of fundraising that celebrates God’s abundance of gifts in all our lives.

We are asking that you prayerfully reflect on your gifts and consider whether God is calling you to lend your willing heart to this important effort. Please do not say “no” because one part of the above plan seems problematic to you. We want to encourage new ways that God can work fruitfully through us. We hope you will consider volunteering to part of the Fundraising Leadership Recommendation Committee. 


