FROM THE PASTOR:

Dear Friends,

As late fall comes to the United States, we are overwhelmed with images of tables weighed down with golden turkeys and platters overflowing with sumptuous foods. Laughing people, who seem to have their every food desire filled on the Thanksgiving holiday, surround the tables. Yet the reality is that throughout the United States and the world many people go hungry. Data released in September 2013, by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) reveals that in 2012, 14.5 percent of Americans, which included more than one in five children, lived in households that had trouble putting food on the table.

In 2013 the Presbyterian Church (USA)'s denominational leaders engaged in a nationwide effort to draw attention to the gross injustice of poverty and hunger in the U.S. and to open new opportunities for education, understanding, compassion, and solidarity. The SNAP/ Food Stamp Challenge is not only a call to hunger and poverty awareness, but also a call to action. We are called by God to be in the world and to seek to make it a better place. Changing hearts and minds are the starting point of building a movement and improving policy.

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP, formerly the Food Stamp Program) currently serves more than 47 million participants in about 23 million low-income households. Enrollment in the program has almost doubled over the past five years as more people struggle to make ends meet. The Challenge simply means choosing for one week to live on the average amount of food stamp support. That means spending only a designated dollar amount per day, per person, on everything that you eat, including breakfast, lunch, dinner, snacks, and drinks.

In worship on **November 9**th Susan Orr, Presbyter of Mission & Advocacy for Genesee Valley, will lead worship and a discussion following about her experience engaging in this challenge last year and how we can participate **November 16**th- **22**nd. We will have a follow up conversation on **Sunday, November 23**rd after worship to talk about our experiences. Here is how it works:

SNAP/ Food Stamp Challenge Guidelines

- 1. Each person should spend a set amount for food and beverages during the Challenge week November 16th-22nd (starting with breakfast on Sunday morning). In the state of New York it works out roughly \$6 per day/ per person.
- 2. All food purchased and eaten during the Challenge week, including fast food and dining out, must be included in the total spending. We suggest planning and buying all of your food for the week at once, maybe on the Saturday before the challenge

- 3. During the Challenge, only eat food that you purchase for the project. Do not eat food that you already own (this does not include spices and condiments).
- 4. Avoid accepting free food from friends, family, or at work, including at receptions, briefings, or other events where food is served.
- 5. Keep track of receipts on food spending and take note of your experiences throughout the week.
- 6. Pray and use the SNAP/Food Stamp Challenge Devotional. Can be found at: http://www.pcusa.org/resource/snapfood-stamp-challenge-daily-devotions/
- 7. If you are unable to keep this fast, take heart and keep trying.
- 8. Consider donating your food cost savings to hunger related programs such as: Food Link, SWEM, Cameron Community Ministry, or St. Joseph's House of Hospitality. You can make your check payable to GPC and in "Memo Line" write "Hunger" the funds will go to one or more of the organizations listed above.

While living on a food stamp budget for just a week cannot come close to the struggles encountered by low-income families week after week and month after month, it does offer those who take the Challenge a new perspective and greater understanding. I recognizing for many in our community and our congregation this challenge is not a choice. My hope and prayer is that our faith community will take this opportunity to stress the importance of our biblical mandate as Christians to ensure that hungry people of the world, including those in our own nation, are foremost in our thoughts, our prayers, our ministry, and our advocacy. Will you join me in taking on the challenge as part of your personal preparation for the Thanksgiving season?
