FROM THE PASTOR:

“The mighty one, God the Lord,
speaks and summons the earth
from the rising of the sun to its setting.” - Psalm 50:1

The summer season in western New York brings with it the opportunity to enjoy long sunny days in the garden, on ball fields, around campfires, and at the lake. I love it when someone shares with me how they experience God's presence in nature (usually it is a sunset). Nodding my head in agreement, I am reminded of the Psalms praising God in the beauty of natural creation (sunsets included) ☺

Author Barbara Brown Taylor in her book, *An Altar in the World*, writes how people seem willing to look all over the place for the opportunity to grow closer to God. "They will spend hours launching prayers into the heavens. They will travel halfway around the world to visit a monastery in India or to take part in a mission trip to Belize. The last place most people look is right under their feet, in the everyday activities, accidents and encounters of their lives."

In *An Altar in the World*, Taylor examines the everyday practices, walking, working, nature, to reveal small windows into heaven and feeling God's presence. Each chapter takes simple customs, like encountering people, getting lost and daily chores, and provides an alternate view to these mundane tasks. Through her unique, thought-provoking style, she teaches through her own life experiences. Taylor teaches us to slow down, take off our sandals and realize where we tread is holy ground.

In worship this summer we will use *An Alter in the World*, and scripture, as our guide to exploring the ways we experience God in the everyday. You are invited (though by no means required) to purchase a copy from your favorite book seller or contact the office and we can order a copy for you for \$9.00. Selections of the book will be referenced in worship, but I assure you reading ahead is not necessary.

It is with great joy we welcome Dave Fish to the pulpit on July 13th. Many folks at GPC know Dave from his time serving as a ruling elder on session, chair of the mission committee, Sunday School teacher, an advisor to the Sr. Highs, and an advisor on Summer Work Projects. Did you also know Dave is participating in the Commissioned Ruling Elder Program with the Presbytery of Genesee Valley? Commissioned Ruling Elders, or CRE's for short, are commissioned and assigned to particular pastoral service in a congregation of the presbytery (not the one they are a member of).

Dave is taking classes at Northeastern Seminary (on the campus of Roberts Wesleyan College). He is enrolled in the Certificate in Christian Ministry, a two-year program. 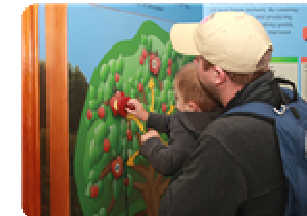
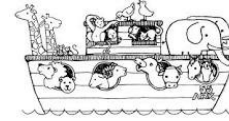
GPC RED WINGS EVENT

1. The Youth Committee creates a list of young people who are interested in being part of Work Project Bound
2. You call or text Keith Hadley with your need – 698-8619.
3. He gives you a name of a youth. He calls the youth and tells him/her that you will be contacting him/her. You connect with the youth and make arrangements.
4. You pay \$8.00 an hour for the work done. Rather than paying the youth, you put the money in the box in the office marked “Work Project Bound” with the youth’s name attached.
5. The youth is then given credit toward his/her Work Project fee.
