

## FROM THE PASTOR . . . .

Dear Friends,

Welcome to a New Year here at Gates Presbyterian Church! The Holy Spirit is moving us right along and empowering us to be faithful to God's call in a number of new ways. The "GPS" or "God's Path Seekers" Team continues to discern the next steps for our congregation in terms of developing alternative staffing, budget and governance structures. You can read more about their work in this issue of the Harbinger. Please keep the team members in your prayers. The Board of Deacons has already taken the first steps in focusing on how they can best serve in their role of compassion and care. They are organizing into teams, meeting less often and encouraging deacons to focus on areas where they feel most "called." There will be a lot to learn moving forward in this new way and they are excited to learn from their experiences. With all these new opportunities unfolding in our midst, it is also important to hold on to our history. There is, of course, our wonderful history as a congregation. From a tavern on Howard Road to the various buildings on Buffalo Road and now our present building, there is a lot to remember. I am thankful our children had an opportunity in the fall to hear from Carol Balsley and Marge Westfall about that history!

In 2015 we are going to reach even further back into our history and celebrate the confessional nature of the Presbyterian Church and our Reformed tradition. We normally think about "confessing" as what we do on a Sunday morning when we recall the ways we participate in a broken and sinful world. In the Christian tradition, the term "confession" also has a more positive definition. It can also mean to openly declare or take a stand for what one believes to be true.

The Presbyterian Church (USA) **currently** recognizes 11 confessions as part of our rich history. I emphasize "currently" because our denomination is discussing whether or not to make the "Belhar Confession" part of this history. The "Belhar Confession" emerged out of the struggle against apartheid in South Africa.

Pending approval from a 2/3 vote from the presbyteries it would join: The Nicene Creed, Apostles' Creed, the Scots Confession, The Heidelberg Confession, The Westminster Confession of Faith, The Shorter Catechism, The Larger Catechism, The Theological Declaration of Barmen, The Confession of 1967, and A Brief Statement of Faith.

To celebrate our rich history and encourage further understanding of the confessional documents we will focus on one confession each month in worship for 2015. May we continue to be a "joyful community empowered by the Holy Spirit" as we "worship God, follow Jesus, and love our neighbors" in the upcoming year.

## G.P.S. Update . . . . .

The ministry of GPC is as strong and dynamic as ever. However, based on input from the congregation and a desire to continue improving our ministry, Session formed the GPS team and charged it with developing alternative staffing, budget, and governance issues. The team has met twice a month since October and will continue to meet until May 2015. The team is learning about congregational redevelopment and exploring alternative ways for GPC to “follow Jesus.” We will keep the mission statement and core values (Worship, Hospitality, Mission, and Spiritual Growth) adopted by GPC, at the forefront of our work and use the Book of Order regularly. In addition, we will consult with the Presbytery Committee on Ministry before any recommendations are made to Session. In May, we will present our recommendations to Session, which will then decide whether to implement the recommendation. We will diligently keep the congregation updated on our progress and welcome any questions, feedback, or recommendations.

On January 25<sup>th</sup> after the potluck lunch, we will be hosting an informational session to discuss a possible strategy. This session is in place of the leadership training and is open to not only the current and new Deacons, Elders, and Trustees, but the entire congregation. This is a team effort between Session and the congregation, so we need everyone’s help. Come find out what is in store for the future of GPC.

The team would like to express to the congregation how exciting this work has been and how “empowered by the Holy Spirit” we have felt. We will continue to “worship God” as the team seeks His path and we hope to create a new beginning for our “joyful community” at Gates Presbyterian Church.
