FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

They originated before my lifetime, but I can remember being a kid and sitting around with a group of friends filling in the blanks with the first noun, adjective, or adverb that came to mind. When all the missing blanks were filled in, the person writing down our answers would read the rest of the scripted story with our answers. Some of the stories were gibberish. They were always hilarious.

Mad Libs were created back in 1953 by one of the writers for the TV show "The Honeymooners." He was writing a new character into the script and was stuck for a descriptive passage. He yelled out to his co-writer for help with an adjective. Before he could refine his request, the co-writer said "clumsy!" He now had a character with a round face, blue eyes and clumsy nose. Mad Libs were born. I love that they are still around. I play them with my kids and yes... there is even an app for them!

A few years ago I co-led a conference with a friend of mine and we came up with an idea to lead groups through a spin off on this idea: "Mad Libs of Prayer." Taking the traditional language from the Presbyterian Church (USA) Book of Common Worship we sporadically dropped words and had the participants fill them in. Some of the results were hilarious and had us rolling in laughter. Other times, the prayers really made sense, actually more sense than the traditional language. The prayers came alive in a rich and vibrant way, giving great meaning in the context of what concerns and joy people have today.

There is a book "Finding God in the Verbs: Crafting Fresh Language of Prayer" that suggests using the Mad Lib model as a way to write our own prayers. We don't often link together "praying" and "playing." But when we think about the time we spend with family and friends having fun there is a connection built. GPC's mission statement says we are a "joyful community." I believe this is true! When we take a moment to step away from the "business" of being church and spend time together laughing and having fun, our relationships with one another and God blossoms. I saw this happen last month every Sunday before worship as people greeted one another, in the pictures from the youth Kick-Off, and at the Potluck. Yes, this even happened during a *gasp* meeting of Session as we enjoyed sharing a meal together and did our own "Mad Lib of Prayer."

Might it be possible that when we combine a bit of play and pray with God we create a new closeness and intimacy? Take notice this month of your time in community at GPC. Where are we having fun and growing in our relationship with God and others?

If you are looking for something more personal, might I suggest asking a friend or family member to complete the following Mad Lib of Prayer with you?

Be joyful. Be playful. Be faithful.



WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY – October 4th

Celebrating World Communion Sunday has taken on a new relevancy and depth of meaning in a world where globalization often has undermined peace and justice – and in a time when fear divides the people of God’s earth. On this day we celebrate our oneness in Christ, the Prince of Peace, in the midst of the world we are called to serve – a world ever more in need of peacemaking.



Mission Focus: Peacemaking Offering – Faith Connects

The Peacemaking Offering is one of the four Presbyterian Church (USA) denominational offerings. Twenty-five percent of the offering received is used for local ministries of peacemaking within the church and its community. Twenty-five percent is used by presbyteries and synods, and 50% is used by the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program. A Peacemaking Offering envelope is included in this Harbinger.

We will also be celebrating a special Fusion World Communion Sunday!
