FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

Last summer the *Presbyterian Outlook* ran a wonderful article on "Doing short-term mission well: Prepare, learn and share." Ellen Sherby shared this story:

A group of women from Presbyterian churches in the U.S. and women from a rural coffee-farming community gather spontaneously to talk about being girls and women in two very different cultures and realities. While they talk, the North American women wash the feet and paint the toenails of their Central American sisters. The Nicaraguan women have worked all week as primary cooks in the communal kitchen to support this mission trip group that visits yearly as part of a long-term partnership. Around the circle of women, laughter, deep conversations and tears flow naturally. The nature of the relationship is one of deep camaraderie and fellowship instead of, "Let me do something for you, a poor Nicaraguan." (July 22, 2015)

The story reminded me of GPC's recent trip to Guatemala where a few of us joined the women in the kitchen on an isolated mountainside home. The women patted the tortilla dough in their hands and attempted to show us the way to make a beautifully symmetrical and flat tortilla. Laughter and joy erupted from our group and we shared stories about the work and role of women in each culture.

GPC is uniquely blessed with the opportunity to be engaged in two long term international mission partnerships and half a dozen local mission relationships. In a couple weeks, a group of five youth and three adults will travel to Jamaica to meet with our mission partners to share in worship, work, and reflect on how together we can bring about God's kingdom in the world. This last fall, Rev. Kimberly Hines, pastor of the Negril charge of churches in Jamaica, came to visit with us. During one of the many conversations we had, Rev. Hines said that in her coming to GPC she saw in new ways how this was about more than "mission" this was about relationships. Our relationship with one another and with God.

When our mission team leaves home on February 13th, we take a part of the congregation with us. Each night we will reflect together on the Lenten theme: "Welcome Home". What it means to leave home and return. How we experience home in places far away. And how God welcomes us back no matter what. We hope you will join us on Sunday, February 28th at 10:00am as we share our reflections in worship and following the service.



NEWS FROM SESSION

Session would like to thank the congregation for their generosity this year. Due to reduced spending and your generosity during the Second Mile Budget Campaign the 2015 budget ended with a surplus. Based on recommendations from the Trustees, Session decided to use this surplus to purchase new carpet for the narthex outside the sanctuary. The old carpet was starting to become a safety concern. So look for new carpet coming soon and thank you again for giving so generously!



The Session approved mailing a letter of support to the Islamic community. This letter was mailed to the Iman at the Islamic Center of Rochester, Sheikh Ismet Husny Ahmad Akcin. The congregation had the opportunity before the holidays to read and sign the letter showing their support. Thank you to everyone who signed the letter.

In last month's Harbinger article, Session shared the new governance model.

It establishes a minimum level of financial participation in the vital work of our church. With this year’s commitment of **\$29.80** per member, we work together with other Presbyterian churches in our presbytery and across the country to further the mission of Jesus Christ around the world. When we come together, we benefit from each other’s gifts, skills, visions, and ministries. Your Per Capita pays for the programs, training, and resources that help us work together to benefit all. Thank you to all members who have already paid their share of this commitment. By contributing your portion of Per Capita, you have freed up dollars in our regular GPC budget for the work our congregation values. If you have not yet contributed \$29.80 per member, please consider doing so. You can use your Per Capita pledge envelope or put your check in a plain envelope marked “Per Capita” and place it in the offering basket or send it to the office.


