Dear Friends,

Spring has sprung, and with it the world has burst into bloom. Flowers are finally free of snow (although an overnight frost is certainly still possible)! Here at GPC, we’ve been busy studying the questions of Jesus . . . and asking a few strange questions ourselves.

“How many breakfast pizzas do we need for confirmation Sunday?”

“Do we have any extra wheelbarrows?”

There was a long few weeks when Melissa and I seriously considered going full party for Pentecost – kazoos, streamers, confetti, and party hats.
