When I think about what it means to be the church in the world today, I think about this cold, windy, wonderful Pentecost Day. This month we will celebrate the contributions of our young people as they lead worship on June 12, 2016. We will honor a great group of seniors who are graduating from high school. They take with them into a new chapter of their lives the love and support of their families, friends, and church community. Throughout my faith journey at Gates Presbyterian Church, I have met people who "do justice, love kindness and walk humbly with their God," as the scripture says. All of the people that I have grown up around in the church have shown these characteristics in their actions. Each and every one of them is kind. I always look forward to coming to church every Sunday because I know I will receive warm greetings from everyone I see. Their kindness and the overall kindness of our church is never absent. As I try to determine what my faith means to me, I feel comfortable in doing so knowing that the people I've met who have taught me about faith, so far in my life, will continue to support me no matter where my faith journey takes me. I know that no matter where I end up, I will always be welcomed home at Gates Presbyterian Church. Through each of you I have learned morals and been given the tools I need to help others through my faith, no matter what my faith and beliefs may be. I have a tangible sense of faith in my church and the relationships I have formed within it. I am so grateful for this church and all of the opportunities I have been given and it has given to others. Thank you for doing justice, loving kindness and walking humbly with God.

KIRKIN' O THE TARTAN: June 5th 10:00am



GUATEMALAN DELGATION TO VISIT ROCHESTER!!

Since 1996, a long lasting relationship has developed between Gates Presbyterian Church, Batavia Presbyterian Church and the people of the Baja Verapaz region of Guatemala, specifically around Rabinal, Panacal and Rio Negro. What started as a mission project at Gates with 36 families, the work has grown to include over 400 Mayan families today!

Over the years, we have visited the region and worked with the people in these rural communities. The projects started spreading out when we joined forces with The Garden's Edge (www.gardensedge.org) who is also working hand in hand with a Mayan cooperative called Qachuu Aloom (www.qachuualoom.org), which is Achi for Mother Earth. With each trip, the groups have learned more and more about each other and our cultures.

This year someone suggested that, instead of us going there, why not bring some of our brothers and sisters HERE – to Rochester! It seemed that the odds might be working against us – obtaining visas and passports and money for plane tickets. We are pleased to announce that we have been successful in our endeavors and on June 22nd, a group of 4 delegates will visit us in the Rochester and they will be hosted by local families. They will be accompanied by the director and founder of The Gardens Edge and a videographer to document the trip. During their stay, we hope to connect with Rural and Migrant Ministries, PeaceWorker Farm, Fruition Seed Co. and other organic farms, children's hospitals, churches and colleges, and still find time to do some sightseeing at Niagara Falls, Letchworth State Park, and the Finger Lakes region. Events with CUSLAR and ROCLA are also being planned.

Let's show them our support by meeting them at the airport on June 22nd at 5:40 PM and line the hallway with GPC and Batavia members and give them a round of applause when they disembark!!

Also, please come to our Beinvenidas Party on June 25th at the Churchville County Park at the Anderson Lodge from 12 -4 PM. It is open to the community and all are welcome. Hot dogs and Lemonade and snacks will be provided for as long as they last. Let's give them a big WELCOME! There is a signup sheet on the kiosk in the narthex for things we need help with. - 3. We'll share your request with interested youth, who will sign up for your gig. Once somebody's signed up, we'll send you their contact information. You connect with the youth and make arrangements.
- 4. You pay \$8.00 an hour for the work done. Rather than paying the youth, you put the money in the box in the office marked "Work Project Bound" with the youth's name attached.
- 5. The youth is then given credit toward their Work Project fee. A win/win to be sure! Thanks!

In 2012 a Memorial Garden Committee

was formed with a vision of creating a blessed place for the interment of ashes of our faithful departed. It is in the spirit of closing the ministry from birth to death that this garden has been created.

The Memorial Garden was dedicated August 11, 2013 and has become a peaceful and comforting place to sit and contemplate thoughts and stroll along the brick walkway viewing the names of those who are honored or remembered as special people in our lives. The Memorial Garden is also used as a special gathering place for prayer and meditation.

The GPC Memorial Garden is financially self-sustaining and is maintained through the use of donations, fees paid for the interment of cremains and the sale of engraved bricks that will be placed in the memorial walkway.

Session has approved that the cost of the interment of cremated remains will be \$400 and this will take effect July 1, 2016. Preplanning and prepayment of interment is available.

There is great emotional, spiritual and psychological value in the time-tested traditions surrounding the way we bury our dead. Cremation can be used as an alternative to cemetery burial while maintaining the traditional funeral home calling hours and funeral/memorial service. The Memorial Garden increases our choices by providing a sacred space, not a cemetery, on our church grounds to remember those who have died.
