FROM THE PASTOR

Dear GPC,

From a young age we are taught the two topics to stay away from in polite conversation: religion and politics. We are all more than well aware the political season is upon us. I wonder, where do you go deeper on matters that are important to you, affecting your daily lives and those of your neighbors in your communities and around the world? Where are those places where people can gather in community, trust one another enough to disagree, learn about different perspectives, and grow in our understandings?

Unfortunately, the church may not be the first place you think of. Once a topic emerges on a political platform, some decide the issue is no longer suitable for discussion in the church. "We believe in the separation of church and state," is recited. I, too, believe the views of one's religious tradition should not dictate the laws of our country. But conversations regarding faith and politics are about so much more than media rhetoric, red state or blue, or choosing a candidate to vote for (endorsing particular candidates is the big IRS "no-no" for ALL non-profit organizations). Such conversations require us to explore our faith in the sovereignty of God, and Jesus' participation in human liberation as the work of the Holy Spirit. In doing so we learn from Scriptures, tradition, and one another how we might best love God and our neighbors.

Such conversations also require a deep commitment from participants to practice hospitality, compassion, perseverance and holding tension in life giving ways. One of the many reasons I celebrate serving in ministry with GPC is the diversity of opinions and perspectives in the life of this congregation, and our ability to engage those differences together with humility and love.

Over the next few months we are going to have the opportunity to explore a number of the questions where the political and theological overlap. The political season may wrap up in November, but here at GPC we are going to engage for a bit longer in what we are calling a “Seasons of Justice.” A number of the conversations during the “Seasons of Justice” will take place here at GPC and others we will partner with or attend events hosted by The Great Rochester Community of Churches (Faith in Action Network), Colgate Rochester Crozer Divinity School, and congregations in the Presbytery. We will have conversations about Israel/Palestine, race, democracy, religious extremism, and ways to recover the heart of democracy. The Senior High Sunday School class will spend the program year learning about other religious traditions and how their faith practices and beliefs influence their daily lives.

I am grateful for the opportunity to share in our questions regarding faith and politics together. More than three decades ago the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) adopted a policy regarding our understanding of “Reformed Faith and Politics” reminding us:

Faith gives us a context for knowing that God wills people to live together in trusting, wholesome relationship. Hope provides a motivation for engaging in a politics of expectation that life can be more just. Love requires us to respond to the love God has shown by loving service to our neighbor. These central Christian virtues transform but do not annul the way Christians in society try to order society through moderation, courage, wisdom and justice.

Read on for the ways you can be engaged through conversation, study, prayer, worship, and action in the “Seasons of Justice” at GPC!
