FROM OUR STATED SUPPLY ASSOCIATE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

I confess - I have not adapted to Daylight Savings Time yet. I know that the one-hour shift shouldn't make that much of a difference, but it feels like a personal affront that it gets dark long before I head home in the evenings. Fall's beautiful colors can't be appreciated when it's dark out, and I resent these increasingly shorter days and longer nights. To combat these early sunsets and long nights, I've been pulling lamps out of storage. I'm getting ready to find my Christmas tree, and hang it with lights. It's becoming the perfect time to start our holiday decorating, and share some light with our community.

In the past few months, many things have gotten dimmer. The election laid bare many divisions in our nation, and left fear in its wake. As the nights get colder, we are rushing to provide safe shelters for people in Rochester without homes. And with so many things to do in our rush towards Christmas, it is hard to figure out where to start.

Thankfully, we have Advent. The month of December gifts us with time to learn the change that Christ's birth has brought to the world. We do not have to wait in the darkness. Instead, we are called together as a church to share the light of our faith, and let that light shine out. We can come together to protect the vulnerable, both here in Rochester and across our nation. We can feed warm meals to people at the Bridge shelter (contact Mary Hadley to help!) and light up their evenings in a safe place to stay. This Advent at GPC our theme is "Let Your Light Shine". We will prepare for Jesus's birth not by waiting for him to heal our divisions, but by preparing the path for Christ to come into the world.

In the devotional *Watch for the Light: Readings for Advent and Christmas*, the editors say that "The love that descended to Bethlehem is not the easy sympathy of an avuncular God, but a burning fire whose light chases away every shadow, floods every corner, and turns midnight into noon. This love reveals sin and overcomes it. It conquers darkness with such forcefulness and intensity that it scatters the proud, humbles the mighty, feeds the hungry, and sends the rich away empty-handed (Luke 1:51-53)." Remember this Advent that Christ's light will soon be bursting into our lives. It is up to us to prepare for the joy of Christmas with our own light in our community. Let us get ready to let our lights shine, and welcome Jesus with love.

GOOD NEWS FROM SESSION

New Sound System

Session has approved the use of the 2015 Endowment Fund gift and a Memorial Fund gift to complete upgrades to the sanctuary audio system. Trustees will use these funds to fix the sound system so that we will no longer hear the radio station in the speakers during worship.

Urban Presbyterians Together

Formed in 2009, Urban Presbyterian's Together (UPT) is an affiliation of nine urban congregations in Rochester which include Laurelton, Dewey Avenue, South, New Life, Third, Trinity Emmanuel, Calvary St. Andrews, Downtown, and Brighton Presbyterian Churches. UPT serves our urban center given its challenges, which are common to many U.S. cities. Their projects include: exploring how we might help improve education in our core city, raising awareness of food scarcity and hunger, combating racism, improving police-community relations, and creating collegiality and mutual support among pastors and lay people. UPT has recently received a \$50,000 grant from Duke Divinity School to strengthen and enhance UPT's capacity to serve its members and the broader community. This twelve month grant will help UPT determine their mission going forward and vision of the future including partnering with suburban congregations. GPC will be one of several suburban congregations that will work with UPT with the ultimate goal of developing initiatives to help urban communities. We are putting together a team of 3-4 congregational members who would like to create the new mission and vision of UPT. 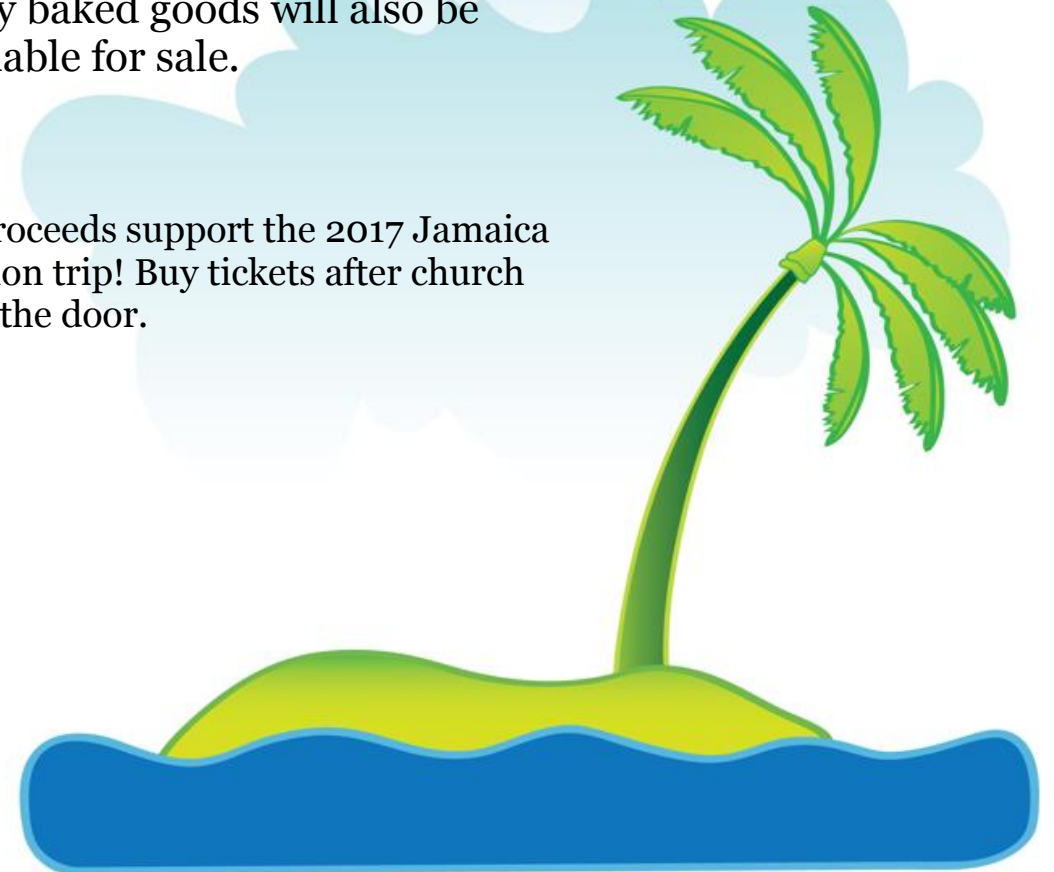
