## FROM THE PASTOR

Dear friends,

One of the greatest joys of being in community at GPC is to have the opportunity to share together in the stories of generosity that lifts up the ways we embrace "life that really is life." Life that recognizes God is at the center of all that we do. Life that makes the connections between what we feel is important to us and how our time and resources support those commitments.

The stewardship emphasis at GPC this year is "Live Generously." I am reminded of how appropriate this theme is for our congregation every time I hear the stories of those in our congregation who live generously by giving of:

- Phone calls to check in with someone who recently lost a loved one;


### On Church, One Book

## OPEN GATE COMMUNITY GARDEN

The second year of GPC's community garden was another "growing" experience.

- Increased the size of the garden adding 3 additional 4' x 8' beds and 3 new 4' x 4' beds
- Added a picnic table within the garden
- Ran a waterline underground from church to garden to minimize dragging of hose for watering & installed 2 rain water barrels
- Built a separate planter for common use (herbs)
- Added 2 more compost bins

Most importantly we were able to have a dedicated bed for Cameron Street Ministries. They were delighted to have fresh herbs for their cooking, as well as other vegetables, & weekly visits have led to us working with them to grow some of their own herbs through the winter.

Goals for 2018 include:

- Involving more non-GPC community gardeners
- Dedicating more space to growing vegetables for community donation
- Adding to the rain water collection system

True gardeners know it is never too soon to start planning for the next growing season. We hope to have new gardeners, so if you think you are interested let us know at any time. If you know anyone from Gates who is interested, even if they are not GPC members, please refer them to us. We are also looking for more hands to help with some of the on-going tasks even if you are not a gardener.
