FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

At least two generations grew up hearing the late radio broadcaster Paul Harvey who was famous for telling stories of little-known facts about a range of topics that were fascinating to learn about. He would take a famous person from American history and tell the story of his or her life before they were famous—but he wouldn’t tell us the name. By the end of the story, it was more or less obvious who he was talking about and he would give us the name of the person, he would inevitably sign off by saying, “And now you know the rest of the story.”

There is so much we know about the Advent and Christmas story. The story we see the children act out on Christmas Eve that gives us the main events; but there is more... there is the rest of the story. The stories not told in the Bible, the stories of our sacred imaginations of the characters surrounding Elizabeth, Zechariah, Joseph, Mary and Jesus. The stories of those living under the occupation of the Roman Empire. People experiencing everyday life filled with the hassles and anxieties that a busy life in a messed-up world can bring. But underneath it all, there is the rest of the story. A story in which God comes, is real and human. A story that happens in a real place and time, where God inhabits the everyday.

This Advent we will explore the theme “The Rest of the Story” as we imagine anew the voices of the stories we’ve heard countless times. We will listen as they speak to us in our current time and place of the hope and joy the promises of God’s presence with us, “Emmanuel.” May all of your encounters this advent season bring hope, and may the story of Jesus the Savior become a part of your own family story this year and every year to come.


