FROM THE PASTOR

Dear GPC,

Planning what to wear at the Easter Sunrise service usually consists of determining if I will need my heaving winter jacket and gloves, or if a lighter fleece will suffice. This year, I am afraid, snow boots will need to be added to the list! I am always amazed though, that the weather never deters a faithful group from rising early from their warm beds and huddling together outside around the table to watch the sun peak over the horizon and hear God's story of hope for this world once more. The service never lasts long, but by the end those gathered depart with a feeling that this is what it means to be the church and witnesses to the resurrection. That we even show up when the conditions aren't ideal, but are confident that the light of God's love will warm even the coldest parts of our heart and world. Because, the resurrection promise is that not even the coldness of death has the final word.

Even if you don't make it up that early, I hope you will make to church throughout Holy Week and the Easter season. If you have never experienced our Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services with creative interpretations of the story, it is always worth the time to hear the story once again. Come experience the beauty of the stained-glass windows in this sacred space as well as to pray your way through Jesus' final journey.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY


